The training is rooted in Government policy and guidance, Resilience Standards and established good practice. The course material has been developed by The EPC in collaboration with CCS, MHCLG and other UK Government Departments, Devolved Administrations, the College of Policing, the University of Manchester and professional institutions to design, develop, and deliver this programme.
